During a sabbatical year in 2006, he taught at Keio University and conducted research at the Institute of International Policy Studies in Tokyo as a Hitachi Fellow of the Council on Foreign Relations. Mr. Jannuzi began his government career in the U.S. Department of State's Bureau of Intelligence and Research, analyzing Asian political-military affairs from 1989-1997. Mr. Jannuzi grew up in Austin, Texas. He holds a Bachelor of Arts from Yale University and Master's in Public Policy from the John F. Kennedy School of Government, Harvard University. He lives in Baltimore with his wife, Dr. Jennifer Martin.
